Ukraine scores in the middle range of the Trilemma at 61, with the three dimension indices remaining relatively stable since 2000. The Ukraine is becoming less dependent on imports, improving its Security score, and diversifying energy generation. On the other hand, the decreasing affordability of gas reduces the score for the Equity dimension. Sustainability scores are low but rising as the fossil fuelled energy system starts to consider efficiencies and emission control. The overall grade is ACC.

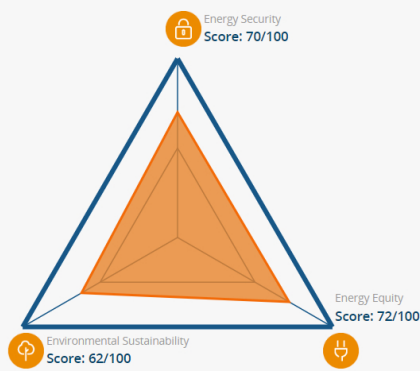

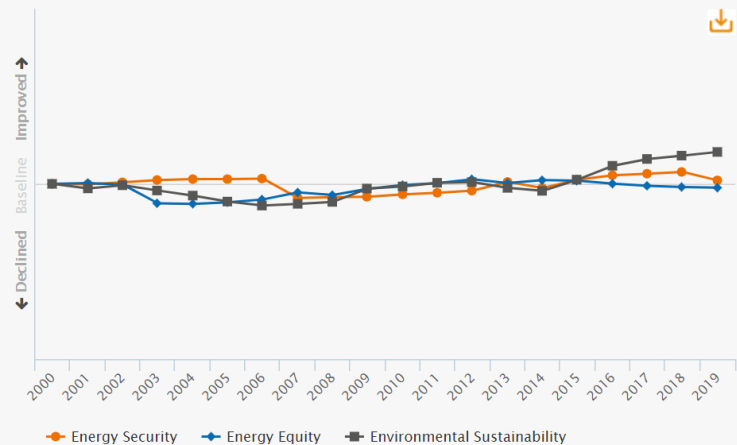
