

Asia - Pacific Energy Leaders Summit

Increasing complexity and unprecedented uncertainty for the global and Asia-Pacific energy sector is making the task of predicting energy futures difficult for policy makers and businesses alike. In recognition of this, New Zealand's peak business advocacy body, the BusinessNZ Energy Council (BEC), in conjunction with the World Energy Council (the Council), is hosting an Asia-Pacific Energy Leaders' Summit: Delivering Resilient Energy Infrastructure.

The BEC is the Council's New Zealand member committee.



This event has the strong support of the New Zealand Government and will seek to develop a shared understanding of the growing resiliency risks and challenges presented by climate change, emerging technologies, extreme weather events, cyber security, and the energy water-food nexus.

The summit will give Asia-Pacific energy leaders an opportunity to develop a greater understanding of how to manage and/or mitigate these risks and challenges.

The agenda will build upon the work being developed through APEC and the insights gained from the Council's studies, including its Jazz and Symphony World Energy Scenarios and its work on financing resilient energy infrastructure.



The summit will include two CEOand Ministerial round tables. These will involve a peer-to-peer dialogue in an informal and off-the-record setting. The summit will explore how the Asia-Pacific energy system can build resilience and prepare for the new normal. These high level invitation-only events will provide a unique platform for you to challenge ideas and look to future-proof the energy systems of the Asia-Pacific region.

Why New Zealand

The country also produces fine wines, seafood and game and has an entrepreneurial business community.
